Anne Frank Essay Assignment

The student will choose one of the three writing prompts from below and write a five paragraph (minimum) literary analysis essay.

The essay...

- ➢ is centered around a clear, specific thesis statement.
- incorporates six pieces (two per body paragraph) of textual evidence to support the thesis and topic of that paragraph. See quotation practice packet for ways to embed quotations.
- > makes analytical, thoughtful observations about the novel (the "so what").
- uses a variety of sentence structures (compound sentences, sentence openers, appositive phrases, semi-colons)
- correctly uses a variety of sophisticated, specific words and avoid repetition of words (i.e. philanthropic instead of giving).
- > is organized in a logical, coherent way, using transition words/phrases.
- is double-spaced and typed using a 12 point font with an MLA header (your name, teacher name, class name, date) and Works Cited page.

The topics...

- 1. Anne's actions and thoughts reveal that she is a complex character. Analyze her as a character and explain how she shows her traits.
- 2. The Van Daans are not the most fun couple to live with. Analyze and describe their relationship.
- 3. The Franks, Van Daans, and Mr. Dussel strive to cope with living cooped up in the attic. Pick one character and analyze and explain their coping strategy.
